THREE MEN ARRESTED FOR EVADING OVER HALF A MILLION IN DUTIES AND TAXES

Singapore, 28 May 2024 – Singapore Customs conducted an operation on 23 May 2024 at Woodlands Link as part of its ongoing efforts to detect and deter tax evasion.

- During the operation, officers conducted checks on three men and a van suspected of involvement in duty-unpaid cigarette activities. Officers subsequently found 1,250 cartons of duty-unpaid cigarettes packed in boxes in the van's rear compartment. \$26,404 in cash, suspected to be proceeds from the sales of duty-unpaid cigarettes, was also found in a backpack belonging to one of the men. The three Indian nationals aged 20, 38 and 39 were arrested.
- Arising from interviews with the three men and using a key found in the possession of one of them, officers conducted a follow-up check on a lorry parked at an industrial building in Woodlands Industrial Park E9. Another 4,200 cartons of duty-unpaid cigarettes were then discovered in two wooden crates in the cargo compartment.
- Altogether 5,450 cartons of duty-unpaid cigarettes and cash amounting to \$26,404 were seized. The total duty and Goods and Services Tax (GST) evaded amounted to about \$590,626. Investigations are ongoing.
- Buying, selling, conveying, delivering, storing, keeping, possessing or dealing with duty-unpaid goods are serious offences under the Customs Act and the GST Act.

Offenders can be fined up to 40 times the amount of duty and GST evaded and/or jailed for up to six years.
